EVERYTHING YOU WANTED TO KNOW ABOUT HILLCLIMBING BUT WERE AFRAID TO ASK . . .

A sports car hillclimb is automobile racing. It is not a time speed distance rally or an autocross around pylons; other activities for which the sponsors, the Allegheny Valley Sports Car Association, are also noted. It is not wheel to wheel racing like Watkins Glen or Indianapolis but racing against the clock. It takes place on a real road with the consequent variations in surface and the normal roadside hazards, not on an artificial circuit. It is not like motorcycle hillclimbs which are run on dirt and the winner of which is often the man who got the farthest up the hill. A sports car hillclimb is a test to see who can traverse a section of climbing, twisting, undulating road in the fastest possible time. If you are a skier it might be likened to a giant slalom only going the opposite direction. The road we are using today has been especially closed for this event by permission of the state and local governing bodies and the property owners.

This hillclimb is one of ten championship hillclimbs run under the sanction of the Pennsylvania Hillclimb Association. This organization has been the chief force and governing body of the sport for the past 12 years and has formulated the rules under which the sport operates. AVSCA, the sponsor of the Red Rock Hillclimb is one of the member sports car clubs who make up the PHA. In addition to our hill other hillclimbs will be held this year at Carlisle, Lebanon, Wilkes-Barre, Schuylkill Haven, Williamsport, McConnellsburg, Weatherly, and Reading.

Hillclimbing is an old sport dating back to the earliest days of the automobile. There is a European championship and two English championship series held every year. Probably the most famous hillclimb in the U.S. is the one up Pikes Peak. Some of the P.H.A. hillclimbs have their share of fame and historical significance too. The Giant's Despair Hillclimb near Wilkes-Barre was first organized in 1906. The winning car was a Daimler which climbed the course in 2 minutes, 11.2 seconds. The current hill record is held by the well known Can-Am racer Oscar Kozaleski with a time of 47.631 seconds set in 1969 and as yet unbroken. Twice a year in Reading, hillclimbers gather to do battle with Duryea Drive, a twisting two and one-half mile road located in a municipal park on the side of Mt. Penn. The name Duryea Drive comes from Charles Duryea, one of the earliest pioneers of the gasoline automobile. He manufactured cars in Reading from 1900 through 1911 and actually used the road up Mount Penn to test his cars. It has been a sports car hillclimbing site since 1951 and has seen many of the country's best sports car drivers competing there.

The cars you will see at Red Rock today vary from small sedans and sports cars seen around Bradford to single seat race cars. Many of the sports cars you'll see racing today while appearing quite like their counterparts on the highways have been subjected to a great deal of sophisticated development in their engines, tires, and suspensions which has required a huge amount of hours and often thousands of dollars. Obviously with the great variety of cars comes great differences in speed and cornering capabilities. Therefore the cars have been divided into classes based upon their potential performance. Each competitor in class runs for trophies and also yearly championship points. Many of the clubs also sponsor six car teams who run for the yearly club championship. AVSCA's 1973 team consists of Bob Snyder, Mark Mancuso and Dave Woodhead from Olean. Dick Gardner and Bruce Perry from Bradford—and Don Smith from Erie, Pa. Bob and Mark drive Triumphs in Class D. Dave drives an MGA in Class F. Dick and Bruce both drive Alfas but in two different classes, Dick in E production and Bruce in B

sedan. Don drives a Ford V-8 powered Austin Healey in modified three. AVSCA's club team has yet to win the club trophy, but the potential is there. In 1972 Dick Gardner was champion of his class with Bob Snyder and Dave Woodhead each finishing second in theirs. In 1970 Don Smith and Bruce Perry each won class championships.

The Red Rock hillclimb course is 1.115 miles long. It consists of both slow and fast corners linked by short straightaways that will allow faster cars to hit over 100 mph in places. There are a variety of spectator areas with a spectator path along the left side of the course (looking up the hill). Spectators are allowed into the pit area below the start line to talk with the drivers and get a closer look at the cars. Portable toilets and concession stands are placed in various locations along the hill.

Please note: Spectators will not be allowed in some areas due to their dangerous locations. Cars will not run if spectators get into these danger spots. Please follow the signs and cooperate with the crowd control personnel. There are loads of safe exciting viewing spots.

Hillclimbing can be a hazardous sport but strict safety regulations are enforced to minimize the danger. All of the competing drivers have competition licenses issued by the PHA only after observation by senior drivers. You may notice cars running during the day with three stripes on the rear fenders. These marks denote novice drivers. Their performance at this and other hills will be evaluated by qualified observers before they get their senior licenses. Besides this licensing program each car must pass a thorough safety and technical inspection. Each car must be equipped with a fire extinguisher, an extremely sturdy roll-over bar and a drivers safety harness which goes over his shoulders, his hips and between his legs. All the drivers are required to have flameproof suits, socks, and gloves and wear an approved crash helmet. Along the hill are several communication/safety stations manned by experienced crews who are in constant telephone contact with all other crews on the hill. Safety regulations are updated and improved yearly.

Co-sponsoring Red Rock with AVSCA is the McKean County Shrine Club. Their aid has been extraordinary and staging this hill without them would have been extremely difficult, if not impossible. Money raised from spectator donations, program sales and the concession stands will go to help their charitable projects. It should be noted that of all the PHA hillclimbs most are co-sponsored by local organizations with the proceeds going to charity.

Hillclimbers are often asked how much money do you win hillclimbing? The answer is none. Yet they will put in untold hours and dollars and tow their cars hundreds of miles to compete for trophies. There must be something to the sport. We hope as spectators you will see some of the fun and excitement that drew these racers here.

A.V.S.C.A. SPONSORS THIS HILLCLIMB. MAY WE INTRODUCE OURSELVES?

The Allegheny Valley Sports Car Association (A.V.S.C.A.) was founded in Olean, N.Y. in 1959 by a small band of sports car fans who wanted an outlet for their enthusiasms. Since that time it has grown to be one of the most active sports car organizations in the north-east. Club activities run the gamut from today's Red Rock hillclimb to a yearly economy run set this year for September. Between these two extremes you'll find AVSCA staging monthly rallies; short and long, winter and summer, day and night, easy and tricky. Besides these monthly events and AVSCA, along with the Quaker State Oil
(over)

Refining Corp., have staged the southern tier tour, for the past 13 years, one of the East's finest independent rallies, drawing the top rallyists from all the surrounding states. Each fall the club sponsors a driver training rally, pitting the top driver training students from eight area high schools in a unique rally/test based on rules of the road. Outside of the rally sphere AVSCA each winter for the past nine years has staged ice trials on nearby Red House Lake. This is a chance to pit your car and your skills against the clock on a specially plowed course on the icy surface.

AVSCA is also a member club in the Western New York Autocross Trail and sponsors one of the yearly trail events at Concord Go-Kart Track in Springville. Besides staging this event, several AVSCA members regularly compete in this Autocross series. Aside from these action events there are several social evenings on the club calendar, culminating with the Annual Xmas Party.

Membership in AVSCA is open to anyone who is interested in cars. Dues are \$10 per year, plus \$5 per year for each additional family member. This entitles the member to the monthly newsletter, "The Clipboard" and to FREE entry to all club events. The club year runs from September to September. Why don't you join for the coming year? AS AMERICAN AS APPLE PIE



"A Short History of the Shrine"

They are a household word in most of America, these red-fezzed jolly men who call themselves Shriners.

Children know them because of the annual Shrine Circus. Fathers know them because of the East-West and North-South college all-star football games.

The disadvantaged know them for the 22 hospitals they run for crippled and burned children.

Anyone who has seen one of their colorful parades never forgets the melange of costumes, clowns, animals, motorcycles and bands.



Anyone who has seen one of their parades is certain never to forget the precision marching corps and the intricate maneuvers of highly trained horses striding in perfect step.

But with the rapidly changing, socially turbulent times, how do they step? Where does The Ancient Arabic Order of Nobles of the Mystic Shrine fit into contemporary America?

"As American as Apple Pie," the Shrine's own history says, "despite its name." Its membership is as diverse as former President Harry Truman, former Vice President Hubert Humphrey, Roy Rogers, John Wayne, the late Harold Lloyd, and Alabama Governor George Wallace.

It supports the government.

It requires a belief in God of all its members.

"As American as apple pie."

Some believe the Shrine is a religion. It is not, but it does practice quasi-religious rites that are just as secret as the passwords that admit members to official ceremonies and serve as a form of communication understood only by Shriners.



Its members wear ornate oriental robes, gowns and medals at rituals. Its meeting halls, called temples, carry exotic names like "El Kahir," "Beni Kedem," "Yaarab," and "Zembo," and are often topped by Byzantine domes.

Its rituals are carefully and colorfully staged with Shriners wearing robes of purple, gold, red and green.

Trained makeup men, also Shriners, apply beards and stage makeup—to make the participants look like the romantic Arabs of old.

Oriental bands play as the non-public pageants are staged in the 172 Shrine Temples of North America.

Beyond the ritual and parades and clowning is a serious side to the Shrine. It operates 22 hospitals for burned and crippled children throughout the country.

Many millions of dollars are spent annually to operate the Shrine Hospitals. An average of \$1,800 is spent for each orthopedic case, and over \$10,000 to treat each burned child.

Each year, the Shrine's 19 orthopedic hospitals discharge more than 8,000 patients, and follow another 70,000 annually through their clinics. Since the first unit was opened in 1922 they have returned more than 180,000 patients to useful lives in society.



More than 1,600 children are treated each year at the organization's three burn hospitals.

Patients are limited to children under 15 years of age from financially disadvantaged homes. Race and religion are not obstacles to admission. There is no charge for hospital care and treatment.

Much of the money raised by Shrine football games and circuses goes into these facilities with more than \$43,000,000 already invested in buildings and another \$10,000,000 allocated for construction. Further appropriations for construction are announced practically every year.



The burns hospitals have developed since 1966 to fill what the Shrine saw as a shortage of facilities to adequately treat burn cases. Each burn hospital has 30 beds and is equipped with the most advanced burn-treatment facilities.



The Shrine was formed in 1872 for fellowship and fraternity, and has thrived under the mantle of pageantry, ritual and ceremony. Today it has approximately 900,000 members—the largest membership in its 100 years.



Leaders say they believe Shrinedom is going to do its part in holding the country together, in supporting the government and democracy.

The good the Shrine does at its hospitals can be measured in terms of the lives it changes. *They are happy and great in number!*

The Shrine's long parades will continue as part of their tradition and the faces of children at their circuses will continue to glow.



They will fit in a comfortable niche in the contemporary American puzzle and, they believe, they will go on being "as American as apple pie."
